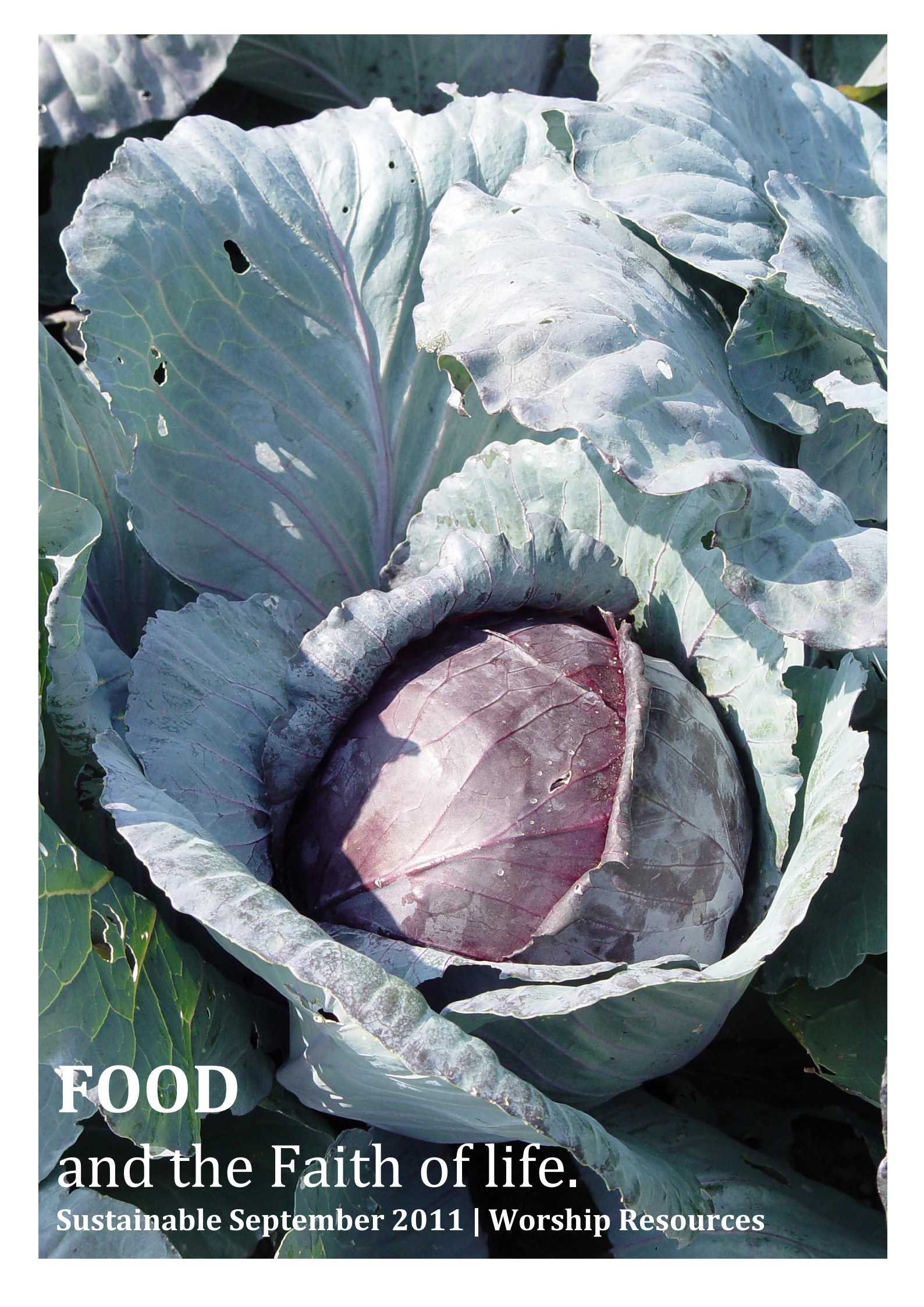

A Litany based on the reading from Romans

Welcome those who are weak in faith,
but not for the purpose of quarreling over opinions;
for God has welcomed them.

Some believe in eating anything,
while some eat only vegetables;
for the Lord is able to make them stand.

Those who eat must not despise those who abstain,
and those who abstain must not pass judgment on those who eat;
for God has welcomed them.



Who are you to pass judgment on servants of another?
It is before their own lord that they stand or fall;
and they will be upheld, for the Lord is able to make them stand.

Some judge one day to be better than another,
while others judge all days to be alike.
Let all be fully convinced in their own minds.

Those who observe the day, observe it in honor of the Lord.
Also those who eat, eat in honor of the Lord,
since they give thanks to God;
while those who abstain,
abstain in honor of the Lord and give thanks to God;
for God has welcomed them.

We do not live to ourselves,
and we do not die to ourselves.
If we live, we live to the Lord,
and if we die, we die to the Lord;
so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's.

For to this end Christ died and lived again;
so that Christ might be Lord of both the dead and the living.

Why do you pass judgment on your brother or sister?
Or you, why do you despise your brother or sister?
For we will all stand before the judgment seat of God.

"As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bow to me,
and every tongue shall give praise to God."
Each of us will be accountable to God.

Let us therefore no longer pass judgment on one another;
**we resolve instead never to put a stumbling block
or hindrance in the way of another.**

I know and am persuaded in the Lord Jesus
that nothing is unclean in itself;
but it is unclean for anyone who thinks it unclean.

Who are we to pass judgment on another?
It is before our Lord that we stand or fall;
